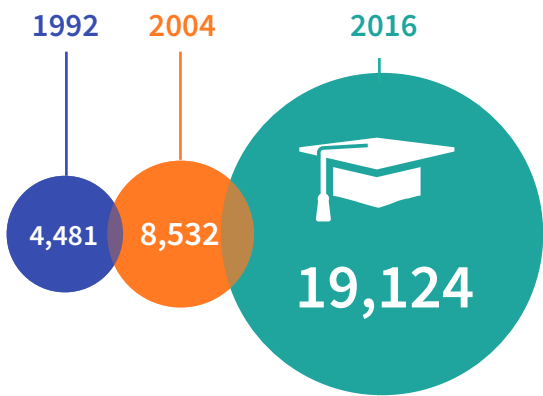


The Academic Public Health Era Graduate Degree Growth from 1992-2016

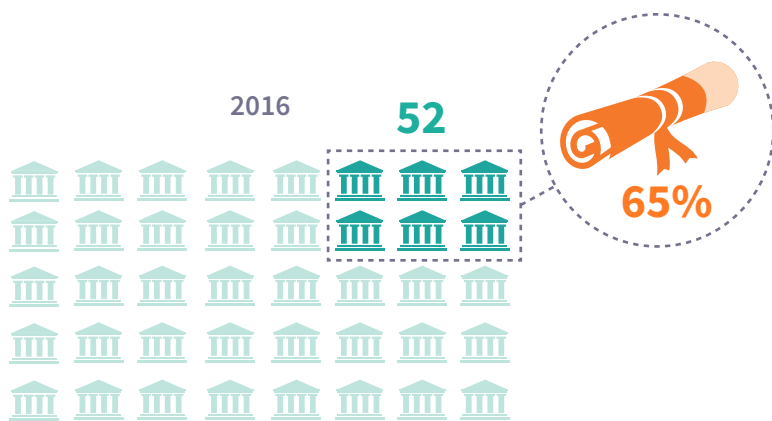
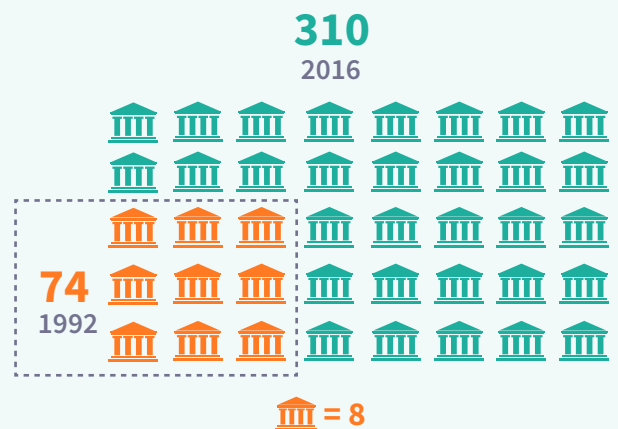


The number of graduate public health degree conferrals increased more than 300%

247,909 degrees have been awarded since 1992.

The number of institutions awarding graduate public health degrees quadrupled

In 1992, 74 institutions awarded graduate public health degrees. That number grew to 310 in 2016.



65% of degrees are awarded by just 17% of all institutions awarding degrees

In 2016, 52 institutions awarded more than half of all graduate public health degrees.

63% in 1992



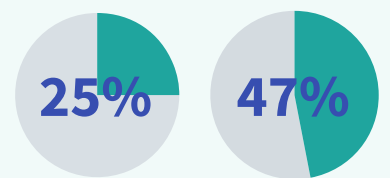
73% in 2016

Academic public health graduate demographics continue to change

In 2016, women represented 73% of degrees awarded and non-white students represented 47% of degrees awarded.
